Next year the jumps will be used for the most part at club events only. This is due to their design and the fact they will not hold up to the physical strain of being moved around frequently.

CLUB NIGHTS

September (Wednesday 30th) - @ Maidenhill Fun Dressage Night - Pairs and Pick-a-Test

There will be two classes - Pairs Dressage and Pick a Test - but the emphasis is on FUN so those members who do not usually 'do dressage' can come along and have a go.

Details/Eligibility:

Pairs - BD and RC rules in respect of tack, horse and rider eligibility etc will not apply to this class so everyone can try it.

The official description for pairs is enclosed with this newsletter but, although the judge will mark it as a normal test and return the score sheet to competitors for interest, the actual placings will be decided by three criteria only:

- How well matched were the horses/ponies (including temperament with each other)
- How pleasing was the overall presentation and composition of the test
- Were all the compulsory movements included

In case you have not seen a Pairs dressage test, the idea is for two horses to perform a free style test as a pair. This means that they perform the movements mostly side by side but can separate at times. There are few compulsory movements and it is up to the competitors to invent as interesting a test/pattern as possible - as in dressage to music. Sheona is, as usual, our local expert and you should give her a ring if you want some further advice. However, remember that this is meant to be a bit of fun, so don't worry about having to make it too complicated. A few basic movements performed smoothly and in harmony will be better than a difficult pattern which does not quite work out. So that you have absolutely no excuse for not doing this we are making it easy for you this year. You do not even have to think up your own pattern as we have made one up for you and it also is enclosed. You can use it as it is or alter it a bit or just make up a completely original one yourself.

Everyone who entered last year had great fun and the judge was most impressed with their efforts.

Pick a Test - Tests to choose from are P7 or N27 or EI44

In this class competitors can choose which test they ride from a Prelim, a Novice and an Elementary. It will be ridden as one class and placings will be decided on overall percentage scores.

In this case BD and Riding Club rules will apply in respect of acceptable bits, tack etc and competitors cannot ride a test under their affiliated BD level.

Stewards: TBC

Eligibility: Riders must be paid up members of the club before commencement of the class. For other rules see descriptions of the classes.

Booking: Please pre-book for this by 'phoning Sheona at any time. Ring her on the Monday preceding the class for times.

Cost: £6 for the night. Maximum of one entry in the pairs plus one Pick a Test per rider unless there are extra spaces.
