The closing date for entries is Friday 11<sup>th</sup> July.

## START TIMES

Competitors not telephoning will be deemed to have withdrawn.

In the event of bad weather prior to the show, please telephone 01355 260 497 between 7pm and 10pm on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> to check that the show is going ahead.

## TROPHIES

The Claymore Perpetual Shield will be awarded for the highest winning percentage mark from classes 5 - 8 on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup>.

A small trophy or prize will be presented to the winner of each class.

## ROSETTES

Rosettes will be awarded from 1st - 6th in each class.

There will be a special rosette awarded to the highest placed junior competitor in each class.

## QUALIFIERS

Classes 1 - 8 will be qualifiers for the Festival Association. All competitors achieving 60% or higher will qualify for the championships to be held at SNEC, West Lothian on 8 - 12<sup>th</sup> October 2009.

Classes 3, 4, 5, 7 & 8 (elementary only) will qualify for the Scottish & Northern Equestrian finals at SNEC, West Lothian - 25<sup>th</sup> October 2009.

### **RULES FOR SCOTTISH & NORTHERN EQUESTRIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFIERS 2009**

1. Qualifiers for the Scottish & Northern Equestrian Championships will be included in all affiliated competitions run from 1<sup>st</sup> February to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2009. The Championships will take place at The Scottish National Equestrian Centre, West Lothian on 24<sup>th</sup>/25<sup>th</sup> October 2009.
2. 1<sup>st</sup> in each Scottish & Northern Equestrian Championship Qualifying class will qualify, the qualification being passed to 2<sup>nd</sup> place if 1<sup>st</sup> already qualified. To qualify at all levels a minimum percentage of 64% must be obtained at Preliminary and Novice level and 60% at Elementary and above. If there are insufficient qualifiers then WILD CARDS will be allocated. No score sheets have to be sent with entry forms.
3. The qualifying class for Scottish & Northern Equestrian Championship purposes at all competitions will be the same as the Winter/Summer qualifier class and the winner will be the highest overall percentage. Please note that those entering Training Classes are not eligible to compete in the Scottish & Northern Equestrian Championships. Using this system leaves no competitor in any doubt as to which class the Scottish & Northern Equestrian Championships is run over. Once the competition is over organisers will be requested to send a copy of their results to the Regional Development Officer at the same time as they send their results to BD.
4. The qualifying letter will be handed direct to those who qualify.
5. The championship is only open to the horse/rider combination who qualify.
6. There will be no commanders or whips at the Championship.
7. At the championship official prize giving's will take place and times of each prize giving will be posted on the notice board.
8. As per British Dressage rules only group 7 and 8 riders competing on unregistered horses or horses with less than 49 points are eligible for Preliminary classes. Unregistered horses will have to be registered prior to the Scottish Championships.
9. Novice to Prix St. George classes are all run as per British Dressage rules.
10. As per Championship rules all entries will be drawn for starting times.

## **RULES - PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING NOTES CAREFULLY**

Hats conforming to safety standard EN1384, PAS015 or prefixed with ASTM or SEI must be worn and secured at all times by anyone mounted on the showfield (no Beaglers).

Juniors are aged under 18 years and seniors are 18 years and over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009.

Closing date for entries is Friday 11<sup>th</sup> July. Late entries will not be accepted. Entries must be paid in advance.

Cheques to be made payable to "Polnoon Castle Riders Association" and sent to: The Show Secretary, 65 Oak Avenue, East Kilbride G75 9ED.

If any class has an insufficient number of entries it may be cancelled. Competitors will be given advance notice of cancellation of the class and entry fees will be returned. Entries may be limited.

Dogs must be kept on a lead **AT ALL TIMES.**

All horses and ponies **MUST** be 4 years old and over.

Neither the organisers nor anyone acting on their behalf accept any responsibility for loss or damage to persons, animals or property whatsoever.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without having to state a reason.

Complaints must be put in writing and given to the secretary accompanied by a £20 deposit, which will be returned if the organising committee upholds the complaint.

Registered horses/ponies must compete at their current level.

All junior competitors must be accompanied by a responsible adult.
